### Resident Clinical Pearls

1. Treatment of a massive amlodipine overdose: Explain the mechanism of action of high dose insulin euglycemic therapy in amlodipine overdose
2. Hepatitis C: A Review and What's New: Discuss the progression of HepC therapies and current guideline recommendations
3. Treatment of Atrial Fibrillation in patients with Wolff-Parkinson-White Syndrome: Recognize how the mechanism of Wolff-Parkinson-White Syndrome Effects treatment of atrial fibrillation
4. Use of Alteplase in Patients with Acute Pulmonary Embolism and Cardiac Arrest: Identify various alteplase dosing strategies that have been used in practice and their effect on patient outcomes
5. Management of Refractory Angioedema: Identify the place in therapy for TXA in ACE-induced angioedema
6. New Treatments for Tardive Dyskinesia: Discuss the dosing, administration, safety, and side effects of valbenazine and deutetrabenazine
7. Cangrelor –drug use evaluation with supported evidence: Discuss cangrelor evidence based uses in the hospital setting
8. Lyme Disease: What Every New England Pharmacist Should Know: Identify one complication of Lyme disease
9. Inpatient Management of the Ketogenic Diet: Outline medications that have limited carbohydrate contents
10. Vitamin C in Patients with Sepsis: Describe the evidence of use of vitamin C in patients with sepsis
