## Objectives

### Examining the Controversies of Buprenorphine: Inpatient Management Strategies for Induction, Maintenance Therapy, and Acute Pain Management

#### Management

1) Define the pharmacokinetic and pharmacodynamic profile of buprenorphine from methadone for the treatment of opioid use disorder 2) Recognize the appropriate use of buprenorphine for inpatient induction and maintenance therapy with respect to federal regulatory requirements 3) Identify safe and efficacious buprenorphine induction regimens using current guidelines and data from primary literature 4) Describe acute pain management strategies for patients treated with buprenorphine for opioid use disorder

### Exploring the Advanced Technician Role in the Medication History Technician

1) Define the role of a medication history technician in the medication reconciliation process. 2) Explain the minimum qualifications and training required to become an effective medication history technician. 3) Describe the different elements of the medication history taking process: research, interview and medication history documentation. 4) Describe interview techniques used to obtain most accurate home medication history. 5) Recall common challenges encountered by medication history technicians and techniques to overcome them.

#### For Pharmacists & Technicians:

1) Discuss New Hampshire statutes and rules, with a focus on new regulations related to the practice of pharmacy 2) Identify common violations found by the NH Board of Pharmacy during inspections 3) Describe strategies to prepare for NH Board of Pharmacy inspections

### Burnout in the Pharmacy

#### For Pharmacists & Technicians:

1) Define burnout and its causes 2) Recognize the health risks associated with chronic stress 3) Recognize the early warning signs suggesting that you (or a colleague) are becoming stressed or ill 4) Identify stress management strategies for yourself 5) Restate how and why good self-care must be the priority 6) List ways to drive change and "solutions" for yourself and your profession.
